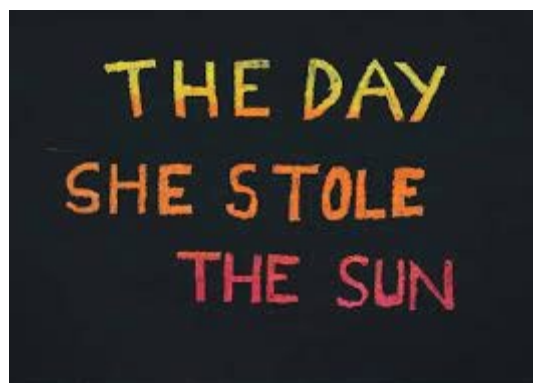




## THE DAY SHE STOLE THE SUN

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- Target Audience: 8-12 year olds
- Resources required:
  - *The Day she Stole the Sun*
  - Paper
  - Pencils
  - Magazines/Newspapers
  - Scissors
  - Glue stick
  - Nature items e.g. green/brown leaves, sticks, charcoal
- Blurb: When bushfires ripped through Cobargo in the early hours of the morning on New Year's Eve, some lost houses, others lost family members, and all have a story to tell about that day.

### ACTIVITY SUGGESTIONS:

- Discuss the descriptive language and create a list of words and phrases that create powerful imagery of the fire.
- Have students search through newspapers and magazines for words they can use to describe a bushfire or being threatened by a fire. Students will create a collage similar to the story. Once all words are cut out, students place them on the paper and decide on what images they might draw to add to the impact. Once happy with the placement, students can glue their words and nature items and use pencils to add new words and images to create their descriptive collage about bushfires.
